Sunshine to You

Music and words: Lorenz Maierhofer



Choreography using gestures of the International Sign Language:

- * sunshine: The index finger of the right hand is used to draw a circle clockwise in front of the face, and the hand with the fingers outstretched is moved from shoulder height (on the left) downwards to the centre of the body (with the palm downwards).
- * to you: The hand is held flat and moved outwards horizontally in a semi-circle, anticlockwise and with the palm downwards.
- * wherever you are: The backs of the fingers of the right hand are used to stroke the chin gently upwards, twice. The thumb and forefinger then form a circle which is moved outwards to the right of the body and back in a gently rising and falling arc.
- * whatever you do: The same gesture as for "wherever you are".
- * God: The right index finger is pointed upwards.
- * bless: The outstretched index and middle fingers of the right hand held together horizontally, one above the other make the sign of the cross at chest height.
- * you: The same gesture as for "to you".
- * **good rain**: The fingers of the right hand, moving to simulate raindrops, are allowed to fall from head height to the centre of the body.
- * **soft winds:** The outstretched index and middle fingers of the right hand with the fingertips pointing upwards are used to describe two anticlockwise circular movements.
